To promote and assist each individual with their personal preferences to empower their daily care and community involvement; and, to follow through with respectful communication and their right to a positive and satisfying life.

## Residential Services

The Residential Services program was established in 1988 to provide stable, nurturing homes for individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities, and offer them an opportunity to live as independent as possible. All of the homes provide 24/7 support including: daily living services, recreational activities, on-going advocacy, and person-centered planning. We currently have 16 homes serving adults in Marion, Polk, Linn and Clackamas counties.

Three homes are equipped to treat medically fragile customers. Services are provided by a caring and passionate team consisting of Direct Care Professionals, Certified Nursing Assistants, Licensed Practical Nurses, and Registered Nurses as medically necessary.

With the goal of providing a “Circle of Support” for each customer, our staff seek to strengthen relationships with extended family members. Family members are welcomed and encouraged to visit the homes whenever they wish to see their loved ones.

## Vocational Alternative Services

Vocational Alternative services provide opportunities for individuals to desire to work in our community. Our services are designed to allow flexibility in development of the individual employment, educational or retirement outcomes and affords individuals with significant barriers the opportunity to achieve those goals in our community.

## Who provides services?

Professional staff working 24/7 at our 16 homes are supervised by House Managers. Our staff are well trained, skilled, and competent individuals who are dedicated and committed to providing the best service to our customers. They are certified in First Aid, Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), Bloodborn Pathogens, Medication Administration and Emergency Preparedness.
