



Lisa and her family are whole again

Lisa* had lived a hard life with surviving chronic patterns of abuse as a child. As an adult she experienced domestic violence and turned to drugs to cope. The effects of such ongoing trauma eventually contributed to a nervous breakdown, loss of her job, and the placement of her children into three different foster homes. Her world had been turned upside down, and she felt she was living a nightmare.

Fortunately for Lisa and her family, Community Counseling Center (CCC) joined her support team. CCC staff worked with Lisa to overcome the effects of domestic violence and helped prepare her to further develop safe, stable, nurturing relationships based on respect for herself and her family.

Lisa lived for her children and became their best advocate. With the support of CCS staff, she was able to reunite with her children permanently. Her newfound confidence and success has enabled her to resume her career as a caregiver for adults with disabilities while she attends college.



Community Counseling Services

In 1959, Catholic Community Services opened Community Counseling Center [CCC], the first outpatient community mental health clinic in the Mid-Willamette Valley. We serve our community's vulnerable children, youth, adults and families suffering from mental health issues.

At CCC, we encourage involvement of parents and significant others in one's

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life whenever possible and involve families in treatment plan development. It is our goal to build on each family's unique strengths to help them raise healthy, empowered children who live self-determined and self-fulfilling lives. At CCC, we support and empower individuals and families to build on their competencies, resiliencies, and preferences to achieve goals that they define; services are often provided in concert with other community partners involved with family.

Our Therapists and Staff

Our caring, culturally-humble staff is committed to strengthening families and helping children and youth succeed at school, at home and with their peers. Our services often reduce the risk of a child's removal from the home, hospitalizations, and other higher levels of care.

We are committed to delivering evidence-based practices (services proven to be effective) in an environment of caring and respect.

At CCC, all of our therapists have earned Master's degrees, or have completed all coursework and are providing almost twice the State of Oregon educational standard for direct clinical hours. They are supervised by an AAMFT - Approved Clinical Supervisor who is on the OBLPCT registry of supervisors and a licensed individual, couple, and family therapist. We offer multi-cultural and bilingual services. Hablamos espanol.

Our Services

At CCC, we provide evidence-based practices that see all people as worthy of respect, who are capable of envisioning and realizing their own futures individually and in relationship to others. Our clinical theory is rooted in collaborative, systemic, and resilience-based ideas, especially Solution-Focused and Narrative individual and family therapy. We also provide psychiatric evaluation and medication management, as well as advocacy and case management.

Who is eligible?

At CCC, we serve children, youth and adults from a variety of family settings, including those living with foster parents, relatives, and single parents. We respectfully and confidentially welcome those of all faiths, ethnic backgrounds, sexual orientation and economic status.

CCC is a contracted provider of services for children, youth and adults covered by the Oregon Health Plan. We also serve those who self-pay and those covered by certain private health insurance.
