Erica's Story

The road to homelessness is not an easy one to travel. It can involve tough choices that don't seem like choices at all. For Erica, homelessness was safer than staying in her own home.

After escaping a domestic violence situation, Erica and her two children, Josh and Zyansty, found themselves homeless. For several years, they bounced back and forth from family members' couches to living in Erica's van.

"I was always worried about my kids getting taken and never seeing them again," Erica said.

Living in a state of desperation and fear, she constantly questioned her instincts. "Do I put them in school or do I not put them in school? Are they going to take them from me? Am I loving them right? Am I taking care of them right?" she wondered. "Of course I wasn't, but I was doing the best that I knew."

Erica hit rock bottom when her children were taken from her and placed in DHS custody. "I was in the dark, and I just prayed and prayed," she said.

After a period of separation and many trials and heartaches, Erica heard about St. Joseph Family Shelter and enrolled in its Transitional Living Center (TLC) program. "I immediately went there, and I got my kids back the same day," Erica said. "It was like 'Wow, how is this happening?' My belief is that it was all the praying. God had to get my attention and He did."

Over the course of several months, Erica worked hard to get her life back on track. She took parenting classes and was put in touch with a parenting coach. She learned how to grocery shop, meal plan and cook for her family. Her children worked with a volunteer tutor to get caught up in school. The family received mental health services, and Erica successfully completed alcohol and drug counseling.

Erica recently graduated from the TLC program, and she and her children moved into their own place in August.

Seeking volunteer service after retiring from teaching, Sr. Marilyn Schroeder heard about St. Joseph Family Shelter and thought she might be able to help the families living there. "I saw there was a need that I could help fill using my teaching experience. I could use my time to help others. It was an opportunity to help bring out the best in others in their educations and even help the children develop their sense of self-worth and feel good about themselves in their learning," Sr. Marilyn said.

"The most rewarding thing for me when I'm tutoring these children is to see the light in their eyes and their excitement about learning," Sr. Marilyn said. In addition to volunteering with the families at St. Joseph Family Shelter, Sr. Marilyn also volunteers at Mission Benedict. "On Fridays, I go and shop with the folks who come to Mission Benedict. That's a great experience too, to interact with those people and see their gratefulness is wonderful," she said. "We have a great time!"

The families served by St. Joseph Family Shelter and Mission Benedict are among the most vulnerable in our community. It is the mission of the ministries to welcome all as if they were Christ and come alongside these families so that they know they are not alone.

"I think when someone comes in from the outside and spends their time helping others, it makes a big difference in the lives of those being served by the shelter and the mission, because volunteers don't have to do it. They do it because they care so much about the people," Sr. Marilyn said. "And after you meet the families living at the Shelter, you can't not care. We volunteers just want to help as best as we can. The community does have a healing power for the people. You can't not be healed if you have the love and care that I see at St. Joseph Shelter."

Dear Friend,

As we enter into the season of gratitude, we are in awe of the generosity of this community as the holidays draw near.

The ability to provide safe, stable housing for homeless families at risk of losing their children, the continued availability of emergency assistance, including food, clothing and household goods through Mission Benedict; the provision of affordable housing for farmworkers and their families through Casa Adele - all of these things are blessings to our community.

St. Joseph Family Shelter, with its comprehensive services to reunify and strengthen families, addresses homelessness at the root of the problem.

Thanks to our partnership with Catholic Community Services, the Shelter now offers more services than ever before. Families receive wraparound services, including parenting, budgeting and nutrition classes, counselors on site who are available to both the parents and children, and access to Mission Benedict. As of November 1, St. Joseph Family Shelter has served 21 adults and 23 children through its Transitional Living Center program, and 700 families (2400 children and adults) through Mission Benedict.

These vital ministries need your support to flourish. On behalf of all those served on the St. Joseph Family Shelter campus, we ask for your continued financial and prayerful support.
