Working Together

Catholic Community Services (CCS) and the Benedictine Sisters of Mt. Angel have collaborated to help individuals and families in need since 2017. This collaboration, along with the strong support of our donors, resulted in the 2023 sale and transfer of the Queen of Angels Monastery, the historic home of the sisters, to the care and ownership of CCS. The monastery grounds comprise 30 acres with existing structures that present an invaluable framework to create an environment of hope and healing for those served by CCS ministries.

Three core youth and family ministries of Catholic Community Services

St. Joseph Family Shelter Transitional Living Community (TLC)

A ministry founded by the Benedictine Sisters, St. Joseph TLC is a place where families experiencing homelessness, addiction, mental illness and other forms of adversity can stabilize, learn new skills, overcome barriers to stable housing and flourish.

Mission Benedict Food & Clothing Pantry

Also founded by the sisters with the help of local volunteers, Mission Benedict will move from its current location across Main St. to the monastery's "carpentry shop." Once moved, CCS plans to offer expanded services such as system navigation and emergency assistance.

Father Taaffe Homes & Pregnancy Support Services (FTH)

Founded by the late Rev. Monsignor Charles Taaffe, FTH serves moms ages 12-22 with transitional/crisis care during and after pregnancy. CCS will renovate two stick-built homes on the monastery grounds, along with some of the single rooms, to expand service capacity for FTH. The comprehensive services offered within a vibrant community setting will ensure moms have the support they need during their pregnancy and that they continue to learn how to protect and nurture their children during infancy and beyond.



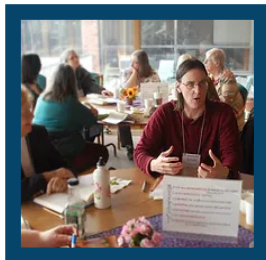
Spiritual Growth & Education

Ministries that will continue to operate at the monastery

The Benedictine Sisters of Mount Angel

Shalom at the Monastery

A monastery is a perfect place for solitude, silence, reflection, and spiritual renewal. The sisters invite guests to come to Queen of Angels in Mt. Angel, Oregon, to seek peace, pray, be still, reflect on their lives and journey with God. Day retreats and recurring monthly workshops/discussions/prayer are offered on a variety of topics. Spiritual direction/companionship is available to encourage spiritual growth in a person's journey.



Oblates of the Benedictine Sisters

The Benedictine Sisters of Mt. Angel have accepted oblates since 1975. They offer an active program that enriches and deepens the spirituality of the oblates: men and women who consider the monastery to be their spiritual home and the sisters their spiritual companions.



Chesterton Academy of the Willamette Valley

Chesterton Academy is a private Christian high school which opened on the Queen of Angels property in 2018. Their classical curriculum combines a broad, liberal arts education with a strong emphasis on the development of Christian virtues and an appreciation of beauty. Through their Three Pillars Model, they form their students in intellect, character and spirituality.

Father Bernard Youth Center

Father Bernard Youth Center (FBYC) was dedicated January 17, 2006 by Archbishop Vlazny of the Archdiocese of Portland and has become a unique focal point for Catholic ministry in the Northwest. With offices and retreat space on the monastery grounds, it is their mission to seek to create a sacred and safe place to encounter the love of Christ.



The Tradition Continues

Prayer and hospitality remain the main ministries of the Benedictine Sisters of Mount Angel. The sisters continue to pray daily the Liturgy of the Hours, or as Saint Benedict called it, “the Work of God.” Following the Rule of Saint Benedict, the sisters pray the psalms, listen to the Scriptures and pray for the needs of family and friends – and for the needs of the whole world. They strive to welcome everyone as Christ.
